Further to our previous correspondence regarding your request for the following information:

*Could you please confirm:*

- \* the system used to report your Nuclear Materials Balances to the ONR*
- \* the supplier responsible for the hosting and maintenance of the system(s)*
- \* the amount of money spent annually for years 2020 - 2024 for the hosting, support and or maintenance of the system(s)*
- \* the amount of money spent annually for years 2020 - 2024 for development and enhancements of the system(s)*
- \* the amount of money spent annually for years 2020 - 2024 for licensing of the system(s)*

Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

A search has been carried out to locate the information you requested and we can confirm that AWE has not been able to locate any relevant information.

Under Section 16 of the FOI Act (advice and assistance) you might find it helpful to note that in line with the Nuclear Safeguards (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 (NSR 19), there is no requirement for AWE to report Nuclear Material Balances to the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR).. All defence sites are exempt from the ONR reporting requirement under NSR 19 as the regulations do not apply to any nuclear materials used for defence purposes.
